

It has been a huge privilege to have worked at Trio for so many years, and to have been part of the success that has come about through the many hours of hard work put in by Roy, and Chris.







During my brief time working at Trio I have come to respect and admire many qualities of Roy's. He is always very helpful and supportive and very quickly made me feel a part of the Trio family.



Nonetheless, the meeting carried on with Dave participating as if nothing ever happened. Gave us quite a chuckle.




